What you need:

Open area outside at night

- 1 telescope
- 1 book on astronomy
- 1 pen
- 1 piece of paper



Find an area outside where you have a good view of the sky. This should be done when the sky is clear without clouds.

Use the telescope to find and identify different constellations that you looked up in your astronomy book. Two popular constellations are the Big Dipper and Orion's Belt.

If you don't have a telescope, you can just use your eyes on a clear night and see how many constellations you can identify.

Make a list of how many constellations you have spotted and identified. There are hundreds right where you live so you can always keep finding new ones!
